This year, we faced many changes in our plans. Wanting to keep everyone safe - as a few staff began to experience Covid symptoms and then tested positive - made for many last-minute changes in staffing. Yet God was faithful to bring in

new, qualified staff to help fill these spots, some with just a few hours' notice. These people willingly jumped in and poured so much love and fun into these kids' lives. It made us think numerous times, "They were meant to be here all along. Thank you, God, for providing."

One of the most powerful things to witness each year is the change that happens in campers in just a week. They step off the bus, many looking nervous and not having much to say. Some come without a friend, feeling overwhelmed knowing they will spend a week with strangers. The transformation that happens within 24-48 hours is amazing. Friendships form. Conversations and so much laughter take place. During evening devotions in cabins, they begin to demonstrate courage by being vulnerably open, sharing things with which they

are struggling. It's a beautiful sight to witness.

The last evening of our high school camp was a night that we as directors and long-time counselors had never experienced before. During our worship time, the campers began forming small clusters and praying together. The clusters then all joined together as one praying and worshipping without the leading of counselors. One of

our campers became overwhelmed thinking of leaving this safe group of peers as camp was ending the next day. As this camper began to grieve, the group encircled this person and proceeded to pray boldly over them. Truly a powerful and beautiful moment that will not only stay in the hearts of the campers, but the hearts of the counselors and directors too.



Family Camps. This summer, we were once again able to witness the generations of many different families enjoying sweet time together. We saw babies experiencing camp for the first time along with campers celebrating 70 plus years at Little Eden. Camper numbers continue to grow - one week even surpassed 400 campers, and our total number of summer campers was 2894, exceeding last year's record! Each week has such a

As mentioned in the last newsletter, Little Eden Camp has continued to take advantage of Consumer Energy Rebates and Programs to update our indoor and outdoor lighting to more efficient fixtures and bulbs as the rebates/programs come available. With our most recent updates, for the month of July, Little Eden reduced its kilowatt usage by 2906 KWh compared with July of 2021, for a savings of \$827.56 during our busiest electrical month of the summer. We look forward to additional savings all year long!



Fall Work Weekend: Come join us!


ittle Eden's Fall Work Weekend is scheduled for October 13-17.
