camp are priceless. Seeing the older campers interact with the younger and pass on faith is definitely a tool God


> uses to build strong families and grow faithfulness among the generations.

From the desk of Wayne Faber, Executive Director


Summer of 2023. On September 15, our 2023 summer program ended. It was a great summer in many ways. We saw record numbers in our high school youth program. This included three high school young men being baptized by Pastor Glenn Nofziger who was at camp volunteering that week.

We also saw the **highest number of summer campers** in the 79 years Little Eden has been in existence. Our total guest count for the summer of 2023 was **3,091**. This is the first time ever that we have had over 3,000 summer campers, which blew past last year's record attendance of 2,894. We thank the Lord for all the youth and families who were able to enjoy camp this year. What a blessing to be able to continue to serve so many people through our summer ministry!

The New Balmy Heights. Many of you were able to see firsthand this summer that Balmy Heights was replaced with a more traditional cabin. Construction began last September and was completed by the first of May. Thanks to many generous Balmy Heights permanent reservation holders as well as other wonderful friends of the camp, this project was completed fully funded. This does more than just update the cabin; it solves several issues with the old cabin and gives us additional beds for our youth camps.

Replacement of the three log cabins. The Birch, Cherry and Juniper cabins are over 100 years old. These three cabins continue to deteriorate due mainly to the moisture found in the log walls and floors. We know that if we don't do something in the next couple of years, we will need to quit using them because they will have decayed to the point where they will no longer be safe to use. This would mean that each summer, there would be about 30 families who would no longer be able to come to Little Eden, plus about 36 youth campers we would no longer be able to accommodate.

As we look to the future, we know they are overdue to be replaced. Our plan is to raise pledges and funds for them over the next year and replace them during the non-summer season a year from now. We are currently working on getting an estimate for their replacement, but it will likely cost about \$880,000 to \$900,000 to replace all three.




3% Credit Card Fee. Each of the last three summers, we have had campers recommend that, like many other organizations and businesses, we pass on our credit card fees to those who choose to use credit cards instead of cash or checks. Our fiscal year ends September 30, and this year Little Eden anticipates paying \$12,000 in credit card fees, even though we have repeatedly shopped for the best processing prices possible.

At the September Board meeting, the board chose to follow the recommendation raised by campers and approved a 3% credit card processing fee for those choosing to use credit cards. Campers are still welcome and encouraged to use check or cash to avoid paying this fee, which will go into effect with all credit card transactions beginning January 1, 2024.

A big thank you to all our volunteers! Lastly, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the hundreds of volunteers we had this spring, summer and fall. With the staffing shortages we continue to experience, Little Eden couldn't minister to everyone we do without the help of so many people who gave of their time. I know I speak on behalf of all the staff in saying to each of you - thank you!

The artesian well at Little Eden


ail Shetler, resource person for **Golf & Fellowship Week** shared a devotional on water and included the following information about artesian wells and the well at camp. We thought you might enjoy it too:

An artesian aquifer is a confined aquifer containing groundwater under positive pressure. This type of well seems to defy gravity because the pressure that builds up between layers of rock gets relieved when the water finds a path to the open air.

The well near Little Eden Camp produces

12, 575 gallons of water per day. It and Old Faceful (the other popular artesian well in Manistee County) are considered to produce some of the purest water in the county and beyond.
